







## **Geo-Resources Cluster Project: Steering Group Meeting Overview**

Following the launch of the <u>Geo-Resources Strategic Sector Strengthening project</u>, the first Steering Group meeting has taken place.




Figure 1 Steering Group structure for the Geo-Resources Cluster project.

The selection of the Steering Group members followed a guideline in the project delivery plan (also illustrated in Figure 1). It is comprised of representatives from the Cornish Chamber of Mines and Minerals CCMM (delivery partner), University of Exeter (SPF fund holder), Cornwall Mining Alliance CMA (strategic partner), and representatives from key stakeholder group, i.e., Cornwall Council, Environment, Careers & Education and Social) to ensure Good Growth in Cornwall and Isles of Scilly.
